FIRST LESSON Isaiah 45:20-25

There is no God apart from the LORD, a righteous God and Savior.

"Gather together and come; assemble, you fugitives from the nations. Ignorant are those who carry about idols of wood, who pray to gods that cannot save. ²¹Declare what is to be, present it let them take counsel together. Who foretold this long ago, who declared it from the distant past? Was it not I, the LORD? And there is no God apart from me, a righteous God and a Savior; there is none but me. ²² "Turn to me and be saved, all you ends of the earth; for I am God, and there is no other. ²³ By myself I have sworn, my mouth has uttered in all integrity a word that will not be revoked: Before me every knee will bow; by me every tongue will swear. ²⁴ They will say of me, 'In the LORD alone are deliverance and strength."" Simeon and Anna see their Savior. This is what they had waited their whole life to see.

²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷ Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸ Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

- ²⁹ "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace.
- ³⁰ For my eyes have seen your salvation,
 - ³¹ which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:
- ³²a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

³³ The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, ³⁵ so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

³⁶There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. ³⁸Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰ And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.



COMMUNION PROCEDURE

The church will be split in half. The two sections in front of the pulpit will receive Communion using the table in front of the pulpit. The two sections in front of the lectern will receive Communion using the table in front of the lectern.

Ushers will dismiss communicants from their pew; however, no one will be dismissed to the center aisle.

- *The pulpit side* will go to their *left* and use the aisle to the left of their pew to walk forward.
- The lectern side will dismiss to their right and use the aisle to the right of their pew to walk forward.

Communicants will wait in the aisle, socially distanced as indicated by the carpet circles. They will approach the individual distributing the bread, receiving the bread in cupped hands. They will then move toward the center of the church to the wine trays, pick up their wine and drink it as the distributor speaks. All will return to their pew using the center aisle. Following the distribution, the pastor will pronounce the general blessing on the communicants.


- Malawi Mission Partner Pastor John Holtz is a son of our congregation serving in Malawi, Africa.

Open Your Christmas Gift

This study is written for personal and family reflection on the gift of the Christ Child.

Background on Paul's Letter to the Colossians

Colossians was written while Paul was in prison in the early 60s AD. The city of Colossae was in Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey). False teachers were saying that Jesus was not enough. That is also our constant temptation as Christians. "God loves me, if..." Paul combats this temptation by opening God's Christmas Gift, allowing us to see the full divine nature of Jesus. In Jesus, we have all that we need. **Read Colossians 1:1-23.**

- I. In Colossians 1:12 we are told the Father has "qualified you" or said that you are "good enough" to share in the inheritance of God's saints. What causes you to feel "not good enough"? What are you tempted to add to Jesus to be "good enough? Consider this list:
 - a. Jesus and my achievements
 - b. Jesus and my strengths
 - c. Jesus and my reputation
 - d. Jesus and my relationships
 - e. Jesus and my ambitions, goals, and dreams
- 2. In Colossians 1:13-14, Paul writes "has rescued," "brought in the kingdom," "have redemption." These verb forms tell us this work is done. Why is that important for us to remember as we struggle with the fear of not being "good enough"?
- 3. In Colossians 1:15-20, Paul opens God's Christmas Gift to assure you that Jesus is fully God, "enough" to save you. Which phrases are especially comforting to you?
- 4. In Colossians I:21, we are described as "alienated from God," "enemies" with "evil" behavior. Explain why a person could say that the sin of thinking "Jesus and... " in Question I is the greatest evil.
- 5. In Colossians 1:22-23, in whose sight are you "holy" and "free from accusation"? Why? How does this answer the nagging fear, "I'm not good enough"?
- 6. Give yourself a present for the New Year. Purchase Jesus + Nothing = Everything by Tullian Tchividjian to better understand God's Christmas gift to you.

- **Celebrate Christmas Present:** Do GroupWork which this week is designed for personal reflection on the Gift that the Father is giving to you.
- Imagine Christmas Future: Read Isaiah 65:17-25, where the LORD describes the new heavens and new earth. Remember that "Jerusalem" was the name of God's Church in the Old Testament The LORD promised that the tragedies and pain the Israelites experienced would be gone. Imagine your current tragedy and pain are gone. That is the Christmas Future Jesus has prepared for you.

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
