St. Paul's Visioning Workshop

Buildings and grounds are tools that St. Paul's uses to fulfill our mission: "By every possible means we bring every person within our area of influence closer to Christ." In many ways our building spaces enhance our ministry. In some ways our facilities hinder our ministry.

The Ministry Board has contracted with Groth Design Group, the architects who designed the Trinity Gym/Café addition, to help us evaluate our current facility and develop plans for the future.

Visioning Workshop – Saturday, February 5 – The First Step

The purpose of the workshop is to discuss as a congregation how our building spaces enhance or hinder our programming and ministries. Paul Barribeau of Growth Design Group will be leading the workshop. Paul is Senior Project Manager for Religious Design. He was the architect for the Trinity Gym/Café addition and has worked with many other WELS congregations in our area.

Schedule - 9:00 to 11:00 am

The first part of the workshop will have information on why it is important to have building spaces that reflect the ministry needs of the congregation. Paul will also share what other churches are doing with their buildings to better proclaim the gospel and serve the surrounding community.

The second part of the Visioning Workshop will be an opportunity for church members to share their insights on how needs of the congregation are helped or hindered by our existing facilities and what visions people have for our campus that can help our ministries thrive.

The workshop will be no longer than two hours in length.

Who is Invited?

We welcome and encourage participation by all members of the St. Paul's family. Our ministries are so varied: traditional worship, The Bridge, our school, childcare, counseling, sports ministry, youth and adult education and fellowship, community outreach and service. For our Facilities and Site Planning Team and architect to plan for the needs of the congregation, we need to hear first what our needs are for all our ministries and how our facilities can better assist our witness. Your input is the first step in the process.

Where?

The workshop will be held in the Grace Room, beginning at 9:00 am. The sanctuary has also been reserved if the attendance requires a larger space.

Online Option

We encourage in-person participation. However, if it is not possible for you to attend in-person, the workshop will also be livestreamed with the chat monitored so that you can ask questions and give comments.

Paul's initial presentation will also be available for later replay with a written summary of the comments that people shared at the workshop. You will have approximately a week to provide additional comments.

Dedication Set for Sunday, February 6

We will dedicate the Community Counseling and Care Center on Sunday, February 6 in all three Sunday morning Sanctuary services. We invite everyone to walk through the facilities and enjoy light refreshments after each service that weekend. Pastor Bonack will be available to answer questions. We have also invited Christian Family Solutions CEO Mark Klug and Dr. Ashley Schoof of CFS, who provides supervision for the center, to join us during the Sunday morning services.

Celebrating our Partnership

St. Paul's is partnering with Christian Family Solutions to open the "Community Counseling and Care Center at St. Paul's" which will provide support and services to the community through professional counseling, support groups, and wellness training. Clinical mental health services will be provided within the center through a licensed mental health clinic operated by Christian Family Solutions (CFS). Many of the center's groups and programs will be offered at no cost to the public as part of the St. Paul's ministry, while clinical services through CFS will be offered on an outpatient basis, accepting most medical insurance plans and self-paying clients. St. Paul's can also provide assistance through our "Friends in Need" Fund. Please do not let finances keep you from getting the mental health services you need.

Pray for Workers

Currently Pastor Bonack is the only counselor at our site, counseling about 60% of his time and doing pastoral work the remaining portion of his time. It is our prayer that CFS can bring in two more counselors. Sadly, there is a shortage of Christian counselors. Please join us in praying for more workers in the counseling field. If you, or someone you know, might be interested in joining our counseling team, please speak to Pastor Bonack.

Support Groups

Our center provides four support groups: DivorceCare, Cancer Support, Alzheimer's Support, and GriefShare. You can learn more about these groups at StPaulMuskego.org/Experience/Counseling-and-Care-Center/ or mark your interest on the back of the Connection Card. Pastor Bonack is also interested in starting more groups for people dealing with alcohol and drug abuse and other issues. Please speak to Pastor Bonack if you have interest in helping with other support groups.

Pastoral or Professional Counseling?

"Pastoral counseling is the pastoral care of individuals as they face their problems, troubles, griefs, burdens, fears and illnesses, which involves not simply giving advice, but assisting them to find help and healing from the word of God" (*The Counseling Shepherd* page xii). All of St. Paul's pastors stand ready to provide the spiritual care of pastoral counseling. They consider it a privilege when God's people share their burdens and cares in a private, confidential setting. Our pastors are trained to listen and then to comfort and guide on the basis of God's Word.

Because of his additional training, Pastor Bonack will focus on professional counseling, helping to overcome mental illness or addiction or relationship dysfunctions that can keep people from hearing and applying the comfort of God's Word to themselves. If you are unsure if you need pastoral counseling or professional counseling, you are encouraged to call Pastor Bonack at 414-422-0320 ext. 119. He can help you determine what level of care you need.

We're going to bring all this to the school, help them organize it, and spend some time with the students. We may have a few workdays at their school as well. COSTA MAYA MINISTRIES

This week Dan and Cindy Thiel and Dave and Michele George will be traveling to the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico to help our Mexican Mission partner in Mahahaual. The congregation will be dedicating its new building on Sunday, January 30th. The Thiels and Georges will help with finishing touches like putting a stucco coating on the interior walls of the new building. They will also represent St. Paul's at the dedication. Part of our "A Cool Million" tithe was used to begin the building fund





for this new facility. They will also bring a gift from St. Paul's to celebrate the dedication and help the congregation pay off the debt on the building by Easter. They still need about \$45,000. instruction and training to gather people in "home groups" to share what they have learned through online study. This is the way God has worked to form a new Latin American synod *Iglesia Christa WELS Internacional*.
