2) This week's message is about obedience. Think back to when you were 5 years old and share a story from that time that shows how you felt about obedience. Does that still accurately represent how you feel about obedience today?
3) Read Romans 13:1-7. Which do you personally find more difficult: a) offering obedience to challenging personalities in leadership or b) loving difficult personalities in your life?
4) Read I Samuel 24:1-13. What's your reaction to David's actions? Have you ever been in a situation where you chose to respect sometime in authority even when they seemed to "have it out for you"?
5) Read Romans 13:8-10 and John 15:12. Events in 2020 so far have given us a lot of new reasons to disagree and become unloving. What's one current debate that frustrates you and how can you show love to someone who holds the opposing view in that issue?
6) Wrap up your time together in prayer for one specific person or issue that you would like God's help with regarding obedience or love.
