NEW SEASON OF BIBLE STUDIES TO BEGIN

A diverse line-up of Bible studies has been scheduled for the Grace Room on Sunday mornings, 9:15-10:15, beginning September 8. Check the church website under the heading “grow” to learn more about the courses and their presenters. .

On August 25, Dr. Stephen Geiger of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary presents, *Living Faith: The Letter of James*. September 1 will be dedicated to exploring how the weekly Group Work discussion guides in the worship folder are used, including breaking into small groups to talk over some of the Group Work questions.

September 8, the 2019-2020 Grace Room series of Bible studies begins with *Relationships in the Shadow of the Cross*, a four-week study exploring skills to more effectively communicate across the sexes, based on the principles God lays down for us in the scriptures. This course will be presented by Rev. James Becker and his wife, Denise, who taught a widely appreciated senior elective for 20 years at Wisconsin Lutheran High School —*From Friendship to Marriage*—that explored healthy, happy, and faith-filled relationships. The Beckers also lead workshops and Bible studies throughout our church body on men and women issues.
