INTRODUCTION

In the beginning was the Word [the Son of God], and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind.

¹⁴ The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him (John 1:1-4, 15; 3:16-17 Evangelical Heritage Version).

Part 1: Waiting for God's Gift

M Our Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, was active in creation. They counseled together and said:

C "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness."

M So God created mankind in his own image.

C **In the image of God he created them. Male and female he created them (Genesis 1:26-27).**

⁸ *[Adam and Eve] heard the voice of the LORD God, who was walking around in the garden during the cooler part of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.*

⁹ *The LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?"*

¹⁰ *The man said, "I heard your voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid myself."*

¹¹ *God said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree from which I commanded you not to eat?"*

¹² *The man said, "The woman you gave to be with me—she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate it."*

¹³ *The LORD God said to the woman, "What have you done?"*

The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

¹⁴ *The LORD God said to the serpent:*

*Because you have done this,
you are cursed more than all the livestock,
and more than every wild animal.*

and you shall eat dust all the days of your life.*

¹⁵ *I will put hostility between you and the woman,

C For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6).

M The Lord himself will give you a sign:

C The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel (Isaiah 7:14).

The first Advent candle is lit.

Part 2: The Wonder of God's Gift

M When the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law,

C to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship (Galatians 4:4-5).

M The time had come. The next step in God's plan was revealed.

²⁶In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

²⁹Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. ³¹You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

³⁴"How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

³⁵The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. ³⁶Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. ³⁷For no word from God will ever fail."

³⁸"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her (Luke 1:26-38).

The second Advent candle is lit.

What child is this who, laid to rest,
 On Mary's lap is sleeping?
 Whom angels greet With anthems sweet
 While shepherds watch are keeping?
 This, this is Christ the King,
 Whom shepherds guard and angels sing.
 Haste, haste to bring him laud, The babe, the Son of Mary!

Why lies he in such mean estate
 Where oxen now are feeding?
 Good Christians, fear; For sinners here
 The silent Word is pleading.
 Nails, spear shall pierce him through;
 The cross he'll bear for me, for you.
 Hail, hail the Word made flesh, The babe, the Son of Mary!

Part 3: God's Gift Wrapped in Humility

- M In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to their own town to register.
- C **So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.**
- M While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son.
- C **She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them (Luke 2:1-7).**

The third Advent candle is lit.

O little town of Bethlehem, How still we see thee lie!
 Above thy deep and dreamless sleep The silent stars go by;
 Yet in thy dark streets shineth The everlasting Light.
 The hopes and fears of all the years Are met in thee tonight.

How silently, how silently The wondrous gift is giv'n!
 So God imparts to human hearts The blessings of his heav'n.
 No ear may hear his coming, But in this world of sin,
 Where meek souls will receive him, still The dear Christ enters in.

Part 4: Celebrate God's Gift

- M And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them,
- C **“Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.”**
- M Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,
- C **“Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests”**
- M When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another,
- C **“Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.”**
- M So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.
- C **When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them (Luke 2:8-18).**

May the “peace on earth to all on whom his favor rests” be our peace. May the treasure that Mary pondered in her heart be our treasure.
- C** For today in the town of David, a Savior has been born to us. He is Christ, the Lord. Amen.
