THE LESSON

In Psalm 51, David confesses his greatest sins and asks God to give him a clean heart. Read it using the two links at left, then check out the video below.

In <u>Matthew 18:21--35</u>, Jesus tells a parable about a man who owes a great debt to his master but is graciously forgiven. A little bit later, this same man sinfully refuses to forgive someone who owes him a small debt. When the master learns of this lack of grace, he punishes the man severely.

Martin Luther says the 5th Petition to the Lord's Prayer (Forgive us our sins) means...."that our Father in heaven would not look at our sins, or deny our prayer because of them. We are neither worthy of the things for which we pray, nor have we deserved them, but we ask that He would give them all to us by grace, for we daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment. So, we too will sincerely forgive and gladly do good to those who sin against us."

THE POINT

Saying "sorry" is part of prayer.

Through the Week

Set up a reminder to say you're sorry to God this week.

• As a family, decorate a sign with the words of Psalm 51:10. You could also add illustrations, such as a heart with bubbles on it to show a clean heart.

• Hang the sign over a soap dish everyone uses.

• Whenever family members wash their hands this week, they can see the sign and remember to tell God what they're sorry for and ask him to give them a clean heart.
