		Suffering Servant. The center chapter is Isaiah 62
61	The Bride of Christ	where the Jerusalem is pictured as the LORD's Bride. "Hephzibah" means "My delight is in her." As you read Isaiah, remember that Jerusalem, also called

63		Zion, is often used as a reference to God's Church. Because the Suffering Servant has come, the LORD
