#### GOD'S COMMANDMENTS

### **Honor Your Parents**

**Exodus 20:12** 

Proverbs 1:8-9; 20:20; 23:22-25

Ephesians 6:1



Honor your father and your mother, that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy a long life on the earth.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not dishonor or anger our parents and others in authority, but honor, serve, and obey them, and give them love and respect.

#### THE LESSON

The Bible passages at left wonderfully express God's desire for children to love and honor their parents. Click the links and read the passages together as a family.

Perhaps the greatest Bible example of a child's obedience to his parents is that of the boy Jesus in the Temple. Watch the videos below and read the Bible text to review this story.

Jesus, when he was about 12 years old, goes to Jerusalem with his parents, Mary and Joseph, and many other relatives and friends. They all went to celebrate the Passover. After the celebration is over, Mary and Joseph leave for home. They assume Jesus is in the crowd returning home with them. When Mary and Joseph discover Jesus is not in the crowd, they head back to Jerusalem and find Jesus in the temple. He is there listening to and asking questions of the church leaders.

Mary and Joseph let their son know they have been anxiously searching for him. They ask Jesus why he is there. Jesus respectfully says, "Why were you searching for me? Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" Then Jesus shows his love for his heavenly Father and his earthly parents. He obediently returns with Mary and Joseph.

#### THE POINT

We show love to our parents by honoring and obeying them.
